Description

A9 Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination

B3.6 Small-scale research and development, laboratory development, laboratory operations, and pilot projects

Sting, construction, modification, operation, and decommissioning of facilities for smallscale research and development projects; conventional laboratory operations (such as preparation of chemical standards and sample analysis); and small-scale pilot projects (generally less than 2 years) frequently conducted to verify a concept before demonstration actions, provided that construction or modification would be within or configuous to a previously disturbed or developed area (where active utilities and currently used modas are rely-accessible).
