

Mr. Matthew Feinberg is a retired Senior Executive from the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) with over 28 years of law enforcement experience. Mr. Feinberg currently serves as the Local Insider Threat Working Group (LITWG) Coordinator within the Department of Energy Office of Intelligence and Counterintelligence.

Over the course of his 24-year FBI career, Mr. Feinberg has served in several FBI Field Offices to include Washington DC, Tucson, AZ and New York City, working a wide range of programs from Counterterrorism, Counterintelligence, Cyber, and Weapons of Mass Destruction.

Mr. Feinberg began his FBI career in 2002 as a Special Agent assigned to the Washington Field Office, where he served as a case agent on the AMERITHRAX Task Force assembled to investigate the anthrax letters mailed to the New York Post, Tom Brokaw, and U.S. Senators Patrick Leahy and Tom Daschle. For his work on the investigation, Mr. Feinberg received the FBI Director's Award for Outstanding Scientific Advancement.

Most recently, Mr. Feinberg served as a Section Chief in the FBI's Operational Technology Division charged with oversight of the FBI's Audio/Video Surveillance Program, Body Worn Camera Program, Radio Engineering Program, Tracking Technology Program, and Technical Training Program. Mr. Feinberg also previously served as the Chief of the FBI's Counterespionage Section where he oversaw the nationwide investigative portfolio of espionage, insider threat, unauthorized public disclosures, economic espionage and tech transfer cases.

Mr. Feinberg is a New York native and holds a master's degree in Chemistry from Binghamton University.

Before joining the FBI, he was a Trooper with the New York State Police. He is married with two children.
